He wants us offering ourselves as "living sacrifices" unto Him for His purpose and use.


Consecrate yourself to God and be set apart and ready for any good work!

You will need to pick a form up from the driver license office and bring it into the Scott County Veteran Affairs office, along with your DD 214, discharge papers, to have it cleared and signed off by the Veteran Affairs officer.

You should make an appointment to bring that DD 214 to my office so that you will not have to wait while I am working with another Veteran.

Saint Patrick's Day or the Feast of Saint Patrick

Saint Patrick's Day or the Feast of Saint Patrick (<u>Irish</u>: Lá Fhéile Pádraig, "the Day of the Festival of Patrick") is a cultural and religious <u>holiday</u> celebrated on 17 March. It is named after <u>Saint Patrick</u> (c. AD 385–461), the most commonly recognised of the <u>patron</u> saints of Ireland.

Saint Patrick's Day was made an official Christian <u>feast day</u> in the early seventeenth century and is observed by the <u>Catholic Church</u>, the <u>Anglican Communion</u> (especially the <u>Church of Ireland</u>), [2] the <u>Eastern Orthodox Church</u> and <u>Lutheran Church</u>. The day commemorates Saint Patrick and the arrival of <u>Christianity in Ireland</u>, [11] as well as <u>Irish heritage and culture</u> in general. [3]

The day generally involves public parades and festivals, $\underline{c\'eilithe}$, and wearing of green attire or $\underline{shamrocks}$. [4] Christians also attend $\underline{church\ services}^{[3][5]}$ and the \underline{Lenten} restrictions \underline{on} eating and $\underline{drinking\ alcohol}$ are lifted for the day. Saint Patrick's Day is a public holiday in the Republic of Ireland, Northern Ireland, Newfoundland and Labrador and Montserrat. It is also widely celebrated by the Irish diaspora around the world; especially in Britain, Canada, the United States, Argentina, Australia and New Zealand
